EARL COLLIER MEMORIAL

EARL'S PARENTS GIVE \$500 FOR
UPKEEP OF GROUNDS.

In Memory of Their Son, Who Lost
His Life in Service, Mr. and Mrs.
W. S. Collier Place Fund
With Committee.

Know all men by these presents,
that whereas, Earl Collier, only son
of W. S. Collier and Inez Collier,
made the supreme sacrifice and died
upon the battle fields of France dur-
ing the World War under the flag
of the United States, and whereas,
the Earl Collier Post of the Ameri-
can Legion and Veterans of Foreign
Wars of Olathe, Kansas, and the citi-
zens of the City of Olathe are pre-
paring to erect a monument as a
memorial to the soldiers and marines
of the Spanish-American war and
the World War upon the plot of
ground in the Olathe Cemetery
known as Plot of American Legion
and Veterans of Foreign Wars.

Now, therefore, we, W. S. Collier
and Inez Collier, the parents of Earl
Collier in recognition of the services
of the said soldiers and marines, and
especially as a memorial to their be-
loved son, do hereby donate and set
apart the sum of Five Hundred Dol-
lars (\$500.00), as a perpetual fund,
the income to be used in taking care
of and assisting in keeping in a
proper and appropriate manner the
above described Plot of ground in
which the body of our only son will
remain in rest.

It is stipulated and required that
the said sum of Five Hundred Dol-
lars (\$500.00) shall be held by the
following committee, to-wit:

Dr. C. W. Jones, L. Ellis Divilbiss
and Joseph Brown, and of which
committee Dr. C. W. Jones shall be
chairman.

The said money shall be invested
in Government Bonds, Municipal
Bonds, Building & Loan Association
manner, but not to be invested in
mortgages, and the income thereof
to be used in taking care of and
beautifying said Plot of ground in
such manner as said committee shall
direct.

We do further direct that in case
of the death or removal from the
County of Johnson, State of Kansas,
of any one of the said committee,
the other two members shall elect
some suitable person, a member of
the American Legion or Veteran of
Foreign Wars so long as there shall
remain such members living, able
and willing to act, and afterwards,
then some suitable and proper per-
son, and said committee shall al-
ways consist of three parties, and
be perpetual.

The income of said Fund shall be
used annually for the purposes here-
in specified, or at such times as in
the opinion of the said committee
may be proper.
