EARL COLLIER MEMORIAL

EARL'S PARENTS GIVE \$500 FOR
UPKEEP OF GROUNDS.

In Memory of Their Son, Who Lost
His Life in Service Mr. and Mrs.
W. S. Collier Place Fund
With Committee.

Know all men by these presents, that whereas, Earl Collier, only son of W. S. Collier and Inez Collier, made the supreme sacrifice and died upon the battle fields of France during the World War under the flag of the United States, and whereas, the Earl Collier Post of the American Legion and Veterans of Foreign Wars of Olathe, Kansas, and the citizens of the City of Olathe are preparing to erect a monument as a memorial to the soldiers and marines of the Spanish-American war and the World War upon the plot of ground in the "Olathe" Cemetery known as "Plot of American Legion and Veterans of Foreign Wars.

Now, therefore, we, W. S. Collier and Inez Collier, the parents of Earl Collier in recognition of the services of the said soldiers and marines, and especially as a memorial to their beloved son, do hereby donate and set apart the sum of Five Hundred Dollars (\$500.00), as a perpetual fund, the income to be used in taking care of and assisting in keeping in a proper and appropriate manner the above described Plot of ground in which the body of our only son will remain in rest.

It is stipulated and required that the said sum of Five Hundred Dollars (\$500.00) shall be held by the following committee, to-wit:

Dr. C. W. Jones, L. Ellis Divilbiss and Joseph Brown, and of which committee Dr. C. W. Jones shall be chairman.

The said money shall be invested in Government Bonds, Municipal Bonds, Building & Loan Association

manner, but ~~not~~ to be invested in mortgages, and the income thereof to be used in taking care of and beautifying said Plot of ground in such manner as said committee shall direct.

We do further direct that in case of the death or removal from the County of Johnson, State of Kansas, of any one of the said committee, the other two members shall elect some suitable person, a member of the American Legion or Veteran of Foreign Wars so long as there shall remain such members living, able and willing to act; and afterwards, then some suitable and proper person, and said committee shall always consist of three parties, and be perpetual.

The income of said Fund shall be used annually for the purposes herein specified, or at such times as in the opinion of the said committee may be proper.
